Driving Directions:

From the Mass. Pike and Route 9 Eastbound:

1. take Exit 12 to Route 9 east (toward Framingham);
2. turn right at the first set of lights onto Country Club Lane;
3. turn left onto Gates Road and bear left at the next stop sign;
4. at the following stop sign turn right and cross Salem End Road onto Badger Road.
5. Turn right at the second driveway; the offices are in the "big red barn" and Edwards House — where the conference will be held — is the large white house.

From Route 9 Westbound:

- (1) pass by the Natick Mall on the right; go about three miles, passing over railroad tracks;
- (2) continue past Temple Street, staying in the left lane;
- (3) make a left turn onto Country Club Lane at the lights by the reservoir;
- (4) follow the directions above from #3.
